PERCENTAGE OF SCRIPTED WORK BY MĀORI CREATIVES HITS AN ALL-TIME HIGH



87% of scripted works staged by New Zealand's professional companies in 2024 were New Zealand works, as identified in Playmarket's annual survey. The total number of scripted works staged was 137, a decrease from the previous year, where 187 works were staged. Nine of the 16 funded companies that presented work delivered programmes with 100% New Zealand content.

Work written by Māori creatives hit an all-time high at 28%, surpassing the record of 25% achieved in 2022 and sustained in 2023. Tawata Productions, Taki Rua Productions, Te Rākau Hua o Te Wao Tapu, Massive Theatre Company, Red Leap Theatre and Barbarian Productions all staged seasons of 100% Māori work.

The percentage of Pasifika and Asian works also increased, with Pasifika works accounting for 13% of programming and Asian works accounting for 14% of programming.

Playmarket defines Māori, Pasifika and Asian works as created with a minimum of one New Zealand citizen of Māori, Pasifika or Asian descent involved in the writing or devising of the work.

Works by NZ women also increased to 56%; works written by trans and non-binary artists increased to 12% of total programming.

The Playmarket survey covers the seasons of all theatre companies funded by Creative NZ under the Tōtara and Kahikatea programmes. These are the four main producing houses (Auckland Theatre Company, Centrepoint Theatre, Circa Theatre and The Court Theatre), the receiving houses (BATS, Basement Theatre and Te Pou Theatre) and the producing companies (Massive Theatre Company, Taki Rua Productions, Tawata Productions, Te Rākau Hua o Te Wao Tapu, Barbarian Productions, Indian Ink Theatre Company, Performing Arts Network of New Zealand, Silo Theatre, Red Leap Theatre). We also knowledge that Te Pou Theatre work as a producing company or co-producer on many productions.

Of the producing houses:

- Circa staged 90% New Zealand work followed by Centrepoint (80%), ATC (67%) and The Court (43%).
- Centrepoint presented a programme where 60% of the work was by NZ women; Circa presented a programme where 55% of the work was by NZ women.
- 60% of the scripted works presented by Centrepoint were written by Māori artists
- ATC presented 3 mainstage works written by Pasifika artists, representing 33% of their total programme.

Of the receiving and co-producing houses:

- 94% of the work presented at Te Pou was written by Māori or Pasifika artists; 35% of the works were co-written.
- Basement presented 26 scripted works as well as a suite of improv, music, live art, dance and comedy events. 96% of their programme was New Zealand work; 69% of

- the season was work by women; 31% of the programme was written by trans and non-binary artists.
- At BATS, 90% of the work presented was New Zealand written. 68% of the season was work by women; 7% of the programme was written by trans and non-binary artists.

Of the producing companies:

- Tawata, Taki Rua, Te Rākau, Massive, Red Leap and Barbarian all staged seasons of 100% Māori work.
- Barbarian maintained its reputation for staging work that champions representation.
- 100% of the programmes presented by PANNZ and Massive were by Māori and Pasifika artists.
- Kia Mau Festival and The Conch did not present fully staged productions of scripted work in 2024.

 comedy, live art, installations, poetry and improvisation are not included here, nor
 are readings, development seasons or online presentations.
- Data is collected about works produced by theatres, works bought in by theatres and tours undertaken by the theatres.
- The data is collected from
 - 1. Season Brochures
 - 2. Websites
 - 3. Theatres
 - 4. Playmarket staff knowledge or licences
- Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number.

DEFINITIONS

- **New Zealand works by women** are defined as works with a minimum of one New Zealand woman citizen or resident involved in the writing or devising of the work.
- Works by trans and non-binary artists are defined as works with a minimum of one New Zealand trans or non-binary identified citizen or resident involved in the writing or devising of the work.

• Māori, Pasifika and Asian works are defined as works created with a minimum of one New Zealand citizen or resident of Māori, Pasifika or Asian descent involved in the writing or devising of the work.
